

Way back in July the club held an Open Evening as part of the Penarth Holiday Festival.

That applies even to the talks they have attended before for two reasons: there is always something new and they are reminded of older things that they had forgotten.

As the evening closed the chairman was pleased to hear several positive comments about the evening. For his own part, he was surprised and delighted to meet an old friend from too many years ago to own up to.
