After dealing with the basics and the essentials of getting started, we concentrate on the things that you need to know next for easier working. If appropriate, notes are handed out, but meetings are generally reported in the press and on our website.

We aim to keep moving with the times. We embrace digital photography; emails; internet telephone calls; and family history research as well as the current trend to establish simple home networks to cope with the growing number of households with more than one computer.

We have free range Brains Trust meetings to take questions of immediate interest.

Our first meeting is on Tuesday 11th September 2012. Doors open at 7.30 pm for an 8.00 pm start. Talks usually last an hour or so. (Sometimes they overrun.) Tea and biscuits are provided after the talks, providing an opportunity to chat with other members; perhaps to discuss an area of computing interest.
